# **Major Projects This Quarter**

### **Valmeyer Road Reconstruction Project**

he construction bid for the Valmeyer Road Reconstruction Project has been awarded to DMS Contracting, Inc.
The project will reconstruct pavement from the Valmeyer Brige to the FCB Bank entrance, remove and resurface
pavement from the FCB Bank entrance to IL Route 3. The project also includes a new box culvert, storm sewer,
curb and gutter. Project construction is expected to begin this spring and will take 3 to 4 months to complete.

Motorists are cautioned to watch for detours and lane closures while the construction work is ongoing. We encourage
you to check thecity website Columbiaillinois.com as well as the City of Columbia Favebook page for detours and
updates on the project.

### **GM&O Connector Trail Project**

The GM&O Connector Trail Project is anticipated to bid in late April. The project consists of constructing an asphalt trail from Cherry Street to Centerville Road. The trail will also be connected to Main street via sidewalk.

# **Distracted Driving**

### **Stay Focused this Spring**

istracted Driving was only a non-moving violation offense until recently. Newly passed laws reclassify it as a moving violation and stiffen penalties to provide automatic driver's license suspension after three moving violations.



Traffic crashes are rarely random occurences. Rather, they are often caused by driver behavior. Distracted driving is a major cause of traffic crashes. The top five distracted driving behaviors are:

- 1. General distraction or being "lost in thought."
- 2. Cell phone or electronic device usage such as texting, emailing or scrolling through social media.
- 3. Distraction by other passengers, pets or unsecured objects in the vehicle.
- 4. Reaching for items like temperature controls, in-dash electronics or sunglasses.
- 5. Eating or drinking behind the wheel.

Remember to stay focused on the roadway to ensure that you, your passengers and other drivers reach their destinations safely.

### Register your Yard Sale

- Visit www.columbialllinois.com/yardsales to register your sale on the City's online portal at least five days before the date of your sale. Shoppers will then be able to view your sale details with the same link.
- No more than two yard signs may be placed at the sale location and the Sign Code prohibits posting sale signs elsewhere in town.
- Each residence is limited to three yard sales per year, including participation in the citywide yard sale.
